Additional Information / Specifications

- The majority of written assignments will be completed in class (outline, draft, and some final presentation copies) under supervision of the teacher. All components of the writing process (outline, rough work, peer-editing) must be re-submitted with the final presentation copy.
- ELA students do, however, have important homework: they are expected to read an average of 20 minutes or more per day. (I understand that there might be days they need to miss, but then their goal is to catch up the next day they can. (eg. 0 minutes one day = 40 minutes the next day, or 10 extra minutes for 4 days.)
- There may be a penalty of **10% per day** for any late assignments or unjustified absences for presentations.
- Students who are absent for a scheduled assessment or presentation must present a note
 addressed to the teacher justifying the absence and specifying that the parent is aware that their
 child missed an assessment or presentation. They should notify me and their classmates as soon as
 they are aware.

- An E.C.A. activity does not excuse a student for a late assignment, a missed test, or a missed presentation. They are expected to communicate with me and all team mates involved in advance and, when possible, we can make an arrangement!
- Students are responsible for keeping track of work they missed and finding out what they missed.
- Lost or damaged books must be replaced.
- Plagiarism and/or cheating of any type results in a mark of zero given for the assignment. Please see the student handbook for more details. Teachers reserve the right to discuss student work with students in the event that the integrity of their work is in question (ie. if uncited sources including AI tools could have been used to generate work).
