Course description:

The visual arts program in secondary 3 is designed to allow students who have acquired the basic knowledge of the art curriculum in cycle 1 to further develop their art skills. Students will enhance their creative skills and deepen their artistic knowledge through various in-class projects and assignments as well as in-class critiques and discussions. There are 2 competencies, Creates Personal and Media Images, and Appreciates Images, which will be evaluated each term, students will be informed and given the criteria for evaluation for each assignment and/or project. The first and second term will be a cumulative grade for the SEC 3 Visual Art course. Term 3 will be the final mark for the SEC 4 Visual Art course, which is the required Art course for the Quebec High School Diploma certification.

Competencies description:

C1: CREATES PERSONAL AND MEDIA IMAGES. Students will be evaluated based on in-class and take-home assignments that reinforce the notions viewed in class while being guided to produce work that has a personal connection to them. Students will also be encouraged to create artwork that delivers a specific message to a specific audience. It also refers to any artwork that has been inspired by a social event, movement or environmental issue.

C2: APPRECIATES WORKS OF ART. Students are evaluated upon their capacity to express their opinion about an artwork both orally and written using the notions and knowledge acquired in the art course, making references and comparisons to certain art movements, artists, techniques and art history facts. They will analyze and criticize works of art considering specific elements and criteria.

Additional information:

- Students are to be responsible of their success in this course by keeping track of the deadlines and evaluation criteria for each assignment and/or project.
- It is the student's responsibility to see the teacher for any missed work in the event of a class absence.
- **Assignments handed in late without previous arrangements or justification in the form of a note from parent/guardian, doctor or administration, will be deducted 10% of the final mark per school day. No extensions for ATC's, as a term project, students are given due dates at the beginning of the year.**
- Students are welcome to work in the art studio to finish projects on remediation days or upon appointment.
- Students must respect studio etiquette at all times: respect their fellow art peers and teacher, the art materials and furniture.
- All students in the visual art program are expected to submit at least three completed artworks that will be displayed in the end of the year **art exhibit** that will take place on **May 28th** in the Foundation gym from 3:00 to 6:00pm. **Participation and presence is mandatory for this event because it is worth 20% of the third term Competency 2 evaluation.**
- As indicated in the school agenda, the use of cell phones are not permitted during class time, unless permission has been granted, therefore such devices will be confiscated and submitted to the administration.
- Students must join their class section in Google Classroom where they can access information about their art projects and submit written assignments.
