

Additional Information / Specifications

- All written assignments for this course will be completed in class (outline, rough, and final draft) under the supervision of the teacher. All components of the writing process (outline, rough work, peer-editing) must be re-submitted with the final draft. Outlines and rough work may be brought home only with the teacher's permission, otherwise there will be a penalty. No outside work may be brought into the classroom during the writing process.
- Late/incomplete assignments (including missed presentations) penalty: up to 10% per day.
- Students must provide appropriate written justification (note from parent) for any missed evaluation (such as a test or presentation), or for having missed a major due date, such as for an essay or project. The note must stipulate that parents/guardians are aware of the missed evaluation. You must be prepared to complete the work upon your return. If you miss the makeup evaluation, you will receive a mark of 0.
- If you are absent, it is your responsibility to communicate with your teacher to find out what you missed.
- It is recommended that all students engage in personal reading for at least 30 minutes a day.
