### An Enlightening Journey: Pharmaceuticals & Traditional Medicine

This past summer, from August 12<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>, a select group of 12 high school students including myself had the wonderful opportunity to participate in a paid internship focused on traditional indigenous medicine and pharmaceuticals.

First, we spent two days in a Centre d'expertise et de recherche appliquée en sciences pharmaceutiques, or a CERASP lab, where we had the chance to make skincare and wellness products such as body scrubs and cough drops. Walking around and exploring the building with our badges and lab coats made us feel like real experts in the field! In the lab, we learned about a project that was in the works about the extraction of mushroom cytokine as an alternative to the typical shrimp cytokine used in medicine.

On our second day, we visited Clef-des-Champs in Val-David, where we were treated to an in-depth tour of the facilities. We gained insight into the different uses of plants in indigenous medicine while basking in the beautiful August sun. We were also introduced to the way these products are formulated, packaged, and then sold to the public. During our lunch break, we dropped by their lovely store to enjoy some scrumptious detoxing lattes and flavourful herbal teas. Visiting the "witch garden" was an especially exciting part of this day, as we saw a variety of toxic plants, such as belladonna, a popular poison in Ancient Rome.

On the last two days, we were introduced to Cégep de Maisonneuve's techno campus, where we discovered the ideal ways to store and package products to be sent to consumers. Older students presented their findings on different packaging methods like vacuum sealing. We were also able to play around and test some of these methods ourselves!

This fulfilling and unique experience, spearheaded by Ms. Christina Aon from the CERASP, who also happens to be an RWA parent, was initiated to pique interest in pharmaceuticals through hands-on experience rather than traditional academic methods. According to Josh Y., a secondary V student who was lucky enough to be chosen for this program, "it was an incredible experience that taught [him] more about how medicine and culture are intertwined." I couldn't agree with him more!

Apart from the knowledge we acquired, the chance to partake in this internship alongside friends was an enriching and especially refreshing experience leading up to the school year.

Royal West Academy The Royal West Academy school store (RWA CO-OP) began in 2023. It is a volunteer run enterprise, open daily at lunch, which serves as a second hand uniform shop, school supply store and swag/spirit wear boutique. This may be a store, but it is so much more! Students can volunteer on their lunch hour to earn ECA credits and referrals for summer job applications. Students create art pieces for decoration and signs for the store, they create "spirit wear" through tie-dye workshops, they express themselves on our "chalk-wall", they stock shelves, do inventory, work the cash, triage the donations, lead the merchandising of our display case, stock the vending machine, all while collaborating with a parent volunteer as well as their peers. Staff and students alike have been influential in what we carry and sell. From art pencils, locks, and science boards, to popcorn and RWA tugues, the store is more than a fundraiser for the school. It is a space where students can purchase items, recommend items, donate items, and be a part of their school store.
