<u>Additional Materials:</u> Throughout the year, students will require props (usually found/created at school or at home) for various presentations – be creative with this! We encourage recycling. A prop does not necessarily mean a store-bought item.

Expectations: Participation, collaboration and respect are key components in the Dramatic Arts. Students will work on being supportive and respectful as audience members and team members. These are key components of a successful drama class and evaluation.

Depending on the circumstances, late assignments (including performances) may receive a penalty of -10% per school day. Students should inform me and their group members of potential absences when they can.
